
When it was founded?



Riga State Technical School, was founded in 1919 on December 29.

In 1890 it was renamed into the Nikolai I Gymnasium, which in 1891 was given a building at 1c Krišjāņa Valdemāra Street, built to the design of the architect Aleksei Kizelbaš. After the World War I the Riga State Technical School was established on the basis of the Gymnasium. Its first director was Jan Ozolins. The establishment of the technical college was preceded by the opening on October 21, 1918, at the initiative of a group of civil engineers from Riga, of the Public Technical Construction College.





In 1935, a building block facing Noliktavas Street was built; in the 1970s, a new laboratory building was built. The duration of study is 4 years. Enrollment by the results of the 9th grade or 12th grade.
